**APOLOGIES**

The chairman noted that 6 voting members and 3 office bearers were present.

**MINUTES**

It was noted that at ATTENDEES there were three members omitted. They were G McIntosh, J Jeffrey and A Ayre. Following this the minutes were adopted by A Stewart and seconded by A Ayre.

**MATTERS ARISING.**

A Stewart stated that A Allen, failed to attend the Killin Angling Club meeting. He is continuing to harass anglers who are landing their boats on his shore line. He is not selling permits, and none of this has anything to do with Killin Angling Club. A Stewart went on to state that Brown, Innishoarach Estate has now completed all the necessary paper work. Killin Angling Club Members are permitted to fish and he will be selling 2 permits of his own.

The chairman asked for an explanation about the possible change of the salmon season. A Stewart stated that this was a proposal only at this stage and if accepted would only affect the lower beats of the River Tay.

**SECRETARY'S UPDATE**

The secretary stated that A Stewart had brought to his attention the fact that two riparian owners had been contacted by Dr Andrew Burrows. In an effort to carry out a netting survey into articharr in lochs Iubhair and Dochart. Both owners had refused on the grounds that following a long dry spell and then a spate the lochs would be full of salmon. The heavy handed approach without consultation did nothing to foster good relations between any of the bodies involved. The subsequent reply from Fiona Logan of the Loch Lomond and The Trossachs National Park was somewhat rebuking in nature, but wished to continue good relations with the TLC.

There followed a general discussion on the matter, and although there was approval from the TDSFB, it had not been fully discussed. A Stewart agreed to draw the attention of the Board to the matter.

#### **TREASURER'S REPORT**

The treasurer stated that we still have a healthy bank balance and there are no outstanding bills to be paid.

#### **WEB SITE UPDATE.**

A Stewart stated that he was having problems with the maps and that a faulty disk is away for repair.

#### **ANY OTHER COMPETENT BUSINESS**

The chairman asked about the present situation regarding the proposal for the alteration to the PO. The secretary stated that he had hoped that a representative from DBAA would be at the meeting in order to clarify the position regarding Sir Gavin Lyall. Also several points required clarification from Stanley Angling Club. However, without clarification of these few points he was prepared to make the original draft submission to Louise Donnelly. This was met with general agreement.

A Stewart stated that the Western Catchment Area Report was to be launched on Wednesday 22 September 2010, at the McLaren Hall, Killin, where a buffet lunch would be provided.

The matter of Bye Laws for Loch Lomond in relation to camping, litter and alcohol consumption would undoubtedly cause problems on Lochs Tay Rannoch and Tummel. In view of the Loch Tay Users representative not being in attendance the secretary stated that he would pass the matter on to their secretary, who also gets a copy of the minutes.

There being no further business the meeting was closed.
