**MINUTES**

The minutes were held over and the following points were discussed and the members thought it appropriate to ask the Secretary to take the following action as ongoing business, which had not been finalised.

1. A letter to East Loch Tay pointing out the following:-
  - a) There were still sections of the loch bank that had not been brought under a new access agreement.
  - b) There were still no separate permits with rules for Coarse Fishing despite previous complaints. An example was given from the Killin Club.
  - c) A boat with occupants was stopped on Loch Tay in the West End section for illegally trawling. Charges were made by the Police and Bailiff and goods confiscated. There were three in the boat and there was one permit purchased from the Kenmore Shop.
  - d) No member has attended meeting and there have been no apologies.
2. A letter to Dunkeld and Birnam pointing out the following:-
  - a) Still a lack of access returns for the Club's area whether or not the club has lease agreement they are responsible for ensuring access. Particular note on the River Braan beats. This has been raised on many occasions.
  - b) Non attendance at meetings without apologies. Other members travel considerable distances to attend.
  - c) By not attending the club is not representing the Riparian Owners and if this does not change then it is the opinion of the TLC that letters be sent to all Riparian Owners informing them of this non attendance.
3. A letter to Stanley and District pointing out the following:-
  - a) The TLC has been lead to understand there are beats in the club's area which do not have access agreements and others where access is being allowed without a completed

form giving details. Could this be checked on.

4. A letter to Stormont pointing out the following:-
  - a) There have been no access agreements for the club's area submitted to the TLC, some of which beats the club members fish.

The discussion between the members present asked for the Secretary to make the letters strongly worded and that action is needed urgently on all matters raised.

Copies of the letters to the Club Secretaries are to be sent to the Chair of each club and to the TLC Chair D. Mitchell and to J. Jeffery and Patrick Stuert Fotheringham.

It was also agreed that the next committee meeting date be the 16<sup>th</sup> of September and that at this meeting a list be prepared for submission to the Scottish Government, to include all beats not having an access agreement. This would form the core of the submission to have the Protection Order Amended to not include the list of problem beats.
